RECOGNITION

The MDTP brings families, businesses, and schools together to turn teacher recognition into a year-round, sustained effort. We do this by creating cost effective solutions that involve the community in recognizing teachers statewide at a higher, more frequent level both inside and outside the classroom.

SUPPORT

By rethinking how teachers are recruited, trained, and retained, we can solve issues that prevent them from doing their best work. We engage partners from early childhood to post-secondary levels and seek to create a teacher pipeline that will attract talented people to the classroom.

COMPENSATION

We're exploring how we can develop technology, products, and services that can be used to generate NEW streams of revenue for the education system that are not tied to state funding, property taxes, or tax credits—which can be used to increase teacher salaries.

Our Fiscal Year ran from July 1st, 2019 to June 30th, 2020. We entered the year with so much excitement as our program expanded to the largest it has been since our launch in 2016. We were moving into new schools, which meant we were going to be able to impact the lives of more children through our work with their teachers. This was additionally gratifying because your program doesn't grow without the work making a difference and people seeing value in it. To show our appreciation for people believing in our work, we rolled out all the stop. We made program enhancements and recruited new team members to ensure that we were able to continue offering great service to our new partners. As the school year opened up we entered it full steam ahead. Things were going great. Then the pandemic happened, and the world closed down.

In March we had to end our program year earlier than expected to make sure we did our part to slow the spread of Covid and keep people safe. Though it was sad to not be able to fulfill the work we planned with our partner schools, it presented us the opportunity to truly explore the flexibility of our program model. We were not only able to take the majority of our programs virtual, but we also launched a new initiative during the pandemic called Title I Tech enabling us to assist schools with keeping their students who lacked devices at home to stay connected to their teachers. This adaption reminded me of the strength of us as a people. The power of community. When we come together we can accomplish unbelievable things.

I found myself inspired by the way PEOPLE came together around social justice and the support of black lives. I was motivated by the PEOPLE who stayed home and wore masks to show that they care for others. 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WHAT IS THE MILLION DOLLAR TEACHER TREE

The Problem:

Each year, teachers spend over \$1,000 of their own money on school supplies for their students and classrooms so they can set their students up for a successful school year. The Million Dollar Teacher Project believes that teachers shouldn't have to use their limited resources to enable their students' success, and their own professional development. The Million Dollar Teacher Tree is a vehicle for you, the community, to support our educators with the supplies and training they need to be successful so they, in turn, can make our students successful.

In 2019 the Teacher Tree expanded to a total of 3 locations (Dave and Buster's Tempe, Phoenix College and Pima Traditional School) in addition to the main drive that was held at Scottsdale Fashion Square Mall and on the MDTP website from July 4th – August 4th. The 2019 installment of the tree was used to support the teachers of Pima Traditional School in the Scottsdale Unified School District.

Why Pima Traditional School:

Opened in 1959, Pima Traditional Schools is a Title I primary school in the Scottsdale Unified School District in Scottsdale, Arizona. According to the Standards of the Arizona Department of education, Pima Traditional School is an "A" level school – performing well with high scores in proficiency and growth in student performance. The Million Dollar Teacher Project noticed the hard work that the teachers of Pima Traditional School take to ensure that their students are enabled to seize opportunities for success. In order to make the lives of their teachers a little easier, and their students a lot more successful, all donations to the Million Dollar Teacher Tree went towards the classrooms of these hard working teachers!

Recognition is one of the top three issues adversely affecting teacher recruitment and retention today.

Teachers have cited a lack of connectivity and community support as one of the primary reasons they are leaving or have left the profession. Through this campaign, Million Dollar Teacher Project strives to make teacher celebration and recognition an on-going, meaningful and year-round activity.

This year we celebrated over 900 teachers and brought recognition events to the campuses of Metro Tech High School, Synergy Public School, Union School District, Barcelona School, Paloma Elementary School District, Arizona Desert Elementary, Murphy Elementary School District, Glendale Elementary School District, Granada Primary School, Clarendon School and Solano Elementary School.

CLASSROOM SUPPORT TEAM

Through the Classroom Support Team MDTP recruits volunteers and students from community agencies, high schools and colleges and places 4 interns/volunteers in support of a grade level of teachers for maximum efficacy. The intern's assistance includes, but is not limited to: parent engagement, working with students in groups and one-on-one, technology integration, lesson planning, classroom management, curriculum development and delivery of instruction.

The 2019/20 programs were halted due to the COVID-19 pandemic, but we were still able to have an impact. We brought our Classroom Support Team to 8 classrooms and assisted 32 teachers, engaged 27 interns and gave teachers a combined total of 7,000 hours of their time back. We impacted nearly 30,000 students through our work in 2019.




















BEAT THE CLASSROOM



TITLE I TECH PROGRAM



April 2020

When the world shut down due to the Covid-19 Pandemic, the team at MDTP sprung into action after realizing thousands of students were disconnected from their teachers as schools were forced to close. We were able to partner with the Mathew & Priscilla show from Mix 96.9 to raise \$15,000 towards the purchase of devices and technology to put directly in the hands of kids so they could effectively get online to access their classrooms. We named the campaign #Continuethelearning and received applications from districts/schools across the state requesting assistance. We were able to keep hundreds of kids connected to their teachers and will continue pushing this campaign until accessing education at home is no longer an issue for Arizona students.
